We provide high quality support to build leadership capability and increase the overall effectiveness of schools, through our unique three-year program, which brings together the best practices, resources and tools from education, business and management.

Schools are eligible for the program if they:

- Have an ICSEA of ~1050 or below
- Have a principal and leadership team committed to a three-year improvement journey

How is EDvance different to other professional development programs?



We work within your context

We help you design an improvement plan that helps you make the right changes at the right place for your school.



We use a comprehensive approach for leading school improvement

Using evidenece-based change management processes, the program includes regular workshops and access to experts across education and bsuiness.



We provide in-school PL on establishing a behaviour curriculum and high impact teaching strategies.

PL takes place on staff development days to reduce the need for relief.



Professional mentoring

An experienced mentor works directly with the principal and leadership team for the full three years. Our network of mentors are highly regarded past principals and education leaders.



We support you to build a rich school data set

Data is collected and used to inform ongoing strategic planning that targets and tracks improvement in areas that have an impact on student outcomes.



Organisational health focus

A core element of our program is that school culture or organisational health drives the performance of student outcomes. We provide access to tools to measure, track and improve school health outcomes.



Peer support

The program provides access to a cohort of peers to support learning throughout the program and share best practice with like-minded schools.

The three year journey – what does it involve?

Year 1

- Assess how your school is tracking
- **Learn** about tools for improvement
- Interrogate the research and evidence of what works best to improve student outcomes
- Equip leaders and staff with PL to implement evidencebased behaviour strategies

Year 2

- Execute your strategic plan
- Implement changes to classroom practice
- $\boldsymbol{\text{Learn}}$ from other schools
- **Upskill staff** in the use of high impact teaching practices
- **Evaluate** what works and adapt your plan

Year

- Embed effective practice
- Set the future direction
- Improve literacy across the school
- Sustain the change

How does it work in your school?

Principal and Leadership Team

- Your leadership team will attend workshops and strategic meetings
- You will build your capacity to manage change and lead effective instruction
- You will learn about organisational health, building leadership capability and improving team performance
- You will use your school's performance data and evidence to effect change



Focus on Student Outcomes

You will track your data to inform practice along the way

Whole Staff

- You will use diagnostic tools to understand the experiences and perspectives of staff
- Work with all staff to develop your plan and program of change
- Staff will receive in-school PL and coaching to create consisent whole school approaches
- Work with staff to implement and monitor changes

At the conclusion of the three year program, your school becomes part of the *EDvance Alumni Network* and will continue to be supported and celebrated as you progress further on your school improvement journey.

How much does it cost?

School contribution per annum* (for each year of the program):

- Primary Schools \$13,000+GST
- District High Schools \$15,000+GST
- Secondary Schools \$21,500+GST

An additional variable cost recovery for schools outside the Perth metro area of \$2,500 - \$10,000 (calculated on request for individual schools) will apply. *Note pricing may be subject to change.

Thanks to our generous funding partners, schools are able to join the program for less than the annual cost.

(Program value: \$55,000 per school per annum).
